# Prospects of Modern Piano Pedagogy in Uzbekistan

The Head of State outlined 4 main priorities:

- > increase the role of governing councils and increase the powers of university departments;
- identify the learning process in accordance with the requirements of the market, combine it with production and create an environment for comfortable independent work of students;
- increase the scientific potential of universities by continuing the development of science and innovation;
- Reduce the work with the documentation of teachers and students, as well as reduce bureaucracy and corruption due to the digitalization of the sphere.

These requirements are justified by the need to expand educational programs due to the emergence of a distance learning format, the organization of online and offline classes. In addition, Uzbekistan is gradually transitioning to a credit-modular system of education at universities. These reforms will allow the student to devote more time to independent work and study subjects of interest to him.

An important task was the formation of creative thinking and productive activity of students for the free realization of personal opportunities and abilities in society. As you know, music education at any stage performs two educational functions: the improvement of musical and creative abilities, the formation of students' culture in artistic terms.

At the moment there are two main trends in the field of music education:
