Any layers of vocabulary cannot be compared with language, although the term reflects social certainty, the term also has the characteristic of social inevitability. A term is a linguistic unit that supports the creation of any scientific theories, laws, methods, rules within the network of science. Terminology is the basis of any science, one or another knowledge system cannot be imagined without terminology.

D. Lotte was the founder of Russian terminology, and he was one of the first to discuss the issue of systematization, generalization, and standardization of terms. This was one of the achievements of the scientist, one of his many years of work in the field of linguistics.

A scientist who put forward the thesis "ideal term", in which the term should be unambiguous, clear, short, not have synonyms and homonyms within the field, and also be melodious, he gave his own classification of the acquired term and developed some rules for spelling complex terms is considered.

L.A. Novikov approved the proposal to carry out a step-by-step semantic-comparative analysis of the special dictionary for the study of the semantics of Russian words, from the meaning of a single term to the general meaning of a certain group of terms, as well as widely studying the lexical and semantic categories of the term, he gave his definitions to these categories. , at the same time, he showed the main reasons for the emergence of polysemy, homonymy, antonymy and synonymy of terms. The behavior of the scientist in this regard was unique and made a great contribution to their improvement.

Contributions of Uzbek scientists to the development of the field of terminology and their opinions in this regard are incomparable. In particular, S. Usmanov contributed a lot of information for the development of the field of terminology, all of which are important. Terminological units: "... any innovations both in the field of production tools and in the field of culture and science are first expressed through language units, or rather, terms. In this sense, terminology (a set of terms in a certain language) is a witness and a mirror of modern history. We somewhat agree with the valuable opinions of the scientist, but we need to enrich this definition to express the terms. In our opinion, the terms that have arisen in any special field are certainly the needs of this profession or reality, although the terms are primarily used in the form of neologisms in the structure of speech

and language units, but not all of them are represented by a new name. In addition, depending on the development of the field, they will become part of the general vocabulary.

In order to justify the idea that "in the following years, in connection with the study of terms not only within the framework of statistics, but also within the framework of their functionality, it became clear that verbs are also part of the term sentence", M. Kasimova, going in this direction, strictly emphasizes that verbs are also part of the term sentence and makes them the object of research. According to H. Paluanova: "... a nominative activity aimed at one goal requires that the necessary term should find its most accurate and suitable expression through a special name called a term of information. Giving a name to an event or thing is a necessity unique to human society. As names are given to real and unreal objects in existence, human language becomes such a weapon that a person cannot carry out his physical and spiritual activities without them. It is no exaggeration to say that the issue of terms has indeed been the cause of much controversy for a long time, and it is given according to a special feature or properties.

Some foreign linguists reject the study of the terminological dictionary within the framework of lexicology. After all, terminology means a separate independent system separated from the vocabulary of the common literary language. Some linguists, however, state that terminology can be studied as a sub-system within the overall lexical system of a language.

Conclusion

The terminology of any science is not just a list of terms, but a semiological system that names a system of concepts that reflects a certain scientific outlook. When the need for a system of terms is felt, at this time the science has reached a sufficiently high level of development. In other words, the development of the concept at this level and the giving of a specific scientific name is characterized by the emergence of terms.

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
